## **REPORT**

After nearly three years I am delighted that the BSAK AGM has returned to a face to face event. This report is a reflection on the 2021-22 academic year, but I must use this opportunity to state just how positively different the 2022-23 academic year is now that virtually all COVID restrictions have been lifted.

The 2021-22 academic year was the 53rd year of our amazing School and despite the various COVID compliance requirements, it was another very successful year on many fronts. Once again we managed to provide an exceptional educational experience and throughout the 2021-22 year we lost zero days to school closures where no lessons could take place. The adaptability of our Students, Staff and Parents was key to this, despite at times, this causing logistical challenges particularly around childcare and parent work schedules. Thank you for working with the School on this.

During the year we gained various external awards including Schools Compared Best Post 16 Education and Best School for Art. We have also featured in the Spears Top 100 Schools Global list which was extremely positive.

Our academic success at GCSE has been exceptional with our value added score of +1.21 which equates to over a full grade above predicted externally assessed outcomes. In any context, this is exceptional. Our A level results were also extremely positive and our value added score of +0.46 meant progress of half a grade was made. The very top end of A level at A\* could be a little higher and after extensive analysis, this is a focus moving forward, but overall another set of very strong A level results. The BTEC and EPQ results were sensational, highlighting the benefits of alternative academic pathways for our Students that are offered and increasing at the School.

In addition to excellent academic provision and outcomes, the School prides itself upon a first class holistic education. With over 170 co-curricular activities each week, we really do try to facilitate each student's passion, be that through academic enrichment activities, creative arts, music, drama, sport and so much more. 

# FINANCIAL REPORT

This Honorary Treasurers Report, together with the Audited Accounts for the financial year ended 31st August 2022, prepared by KPMG Lower Gulf Limited, in accordance with International Financial Reporting Standards (IFSR), as issued by the International Accounting Standards Board, was posted on the School's website as part of the AGM documentation.

For the year ended 31 August 2022, the School has reported a net surplus of AED 10.38 million, which represents an exceptional achievement for the 2nd consecutive year. This was achieved through a healthy number of students (1976), a strong demand for student places throughout the year and a continuous effort in controlling operating costs.



Fees remained at the 2020/21 level. Our fee structure maintains the School as a highly competitive provider amongst other British curriculum schools within Abu Dhabi, whilst also being able to ensure that there is a surplus generated to sustain the School as well as capacity for investment in facilities and learning resources.

The operating costs have been prudently maintained during the 2021/2022 financial year and the staff costs have increased in line with the student numbers, to maintain the educational provision at the best possible level.

The School's new Science & Innovation Building is under construction and due for completion in the first half of 2023. You can click here to access the most recent time lapse video.

During 2021/22, we continued to invest in digital technology, including a significant expansion of our Chromebook program into the Primary school. During this process, BSAK also entered into new partnerships with suppliers to introduce upgraded devices for the 2022/23 academic year, a new IT infrastructure management provision and managed print services.

The balance sheet remains extremely robust, and the School continues to exercise caution in managing its liabilities, end of service benefits for staff, property & equipment and assets. As a not-for-profit community school, our ultimate goal is to be able to reinvest all of the cash surpluses into creating and maintaining outstanding learning environments for our Students. This year, the major reinvestment has been the construction of the Science & Innovation Building, which until now has been funded 100% by the School's reserves.

Our plans for the future as the British Embassy School for the United Arab Emirates remain focused on consistent improvement and development of our teaching facilities to support our ever-expanding curriculum.

My thanks, on behalf of the Board of Governors, goes to The Finance Team for their work in preparing the audited accounts and for managing the finances of the School with great diligence.


